Literacy & Reading

Literacy this term:

This term the children will be engaging in creating our own instructions on 'how to plant a radish". The children will be learning how to use a range of sentence openers and suffixes to make their writing more exciting. Following this the children will be creating their own version of 'Jack and the Beanstalk' to become more independent writers. As the children progress towards Year 2 they will be continuing to develop their comprehension skills to retrieve information and become super readers.

Our Literacy targets are:

- I can use the spelling rules for adding -e or -es for plurals.
- I can use the suffix ending -ing, ed, -er and -est.
- I can spell the days of the week.

Mathematics

Mathematics this term:

As the children progress into the term, they will be strengthening their understanding of place value within 100. Following this the children will be using what they already know when counting in 2's, 5's and 10's to solve division and multiplication problems Furthermore, the children will begin to explore fractions in halves and quarters using objects to support their learning. Finally, the children will also begin to learn how different turns and movements can be measured mathematically.

Our Maths targets are:

- To be able to have a greater understanding of place value within
- To be able to use manipulative resources to solve division and multiplications problems.
