Mathematics work this half term:

We will be learning to measure

mass in kilograms and grams; measure capacity and volume (ml and L), measure perimeter of shapes and begin to measure time.

Our targets are:

- I can measure scales (g, kg)
- I can add and subtract mass.
- I can measure capacity and volume.
- I can tell the time to the hour.
- I can tell the time to the nearest minute.
