

# Year Six Autumn Term News

## English

### English work this half term:

During the Autumn Term, pupils will start by writing suspense stories where a discovery in a grandparent's back garden leads to someone trapped in the darkness and transported back in time! Following this, they will move on to looking at poetry all around the Blitz. Children will focus on specific SPaG skills within a unit before writing a part of the text each day. Within each lesson, children will be explicitly taught one SPaG skill and focus on this during their writing, which will give them a better understanding of the vocabulary they will need to understand for SATs.

Within reading sessions pupils focus on one text for the week, with a different skill on different days. Our reading sessions are going to take place daily, and focus on the key skills children will need by the end of the year. Each week, they will focus on different skills, which are all linked to our Ambleside reading characters to help children understand the skill they are learning. Within reading lessons, children will be learning how to understand texts, and answer a range of questions about them. Each week, key skills will be taught (retrieval, words in context and inference), along with additional skills which will be taught throughout the term.

### Our targets are:

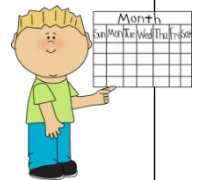
- To use a range of sentence types.

## Mathematics



### Mathematics work this half term:

In Maths this half term our focus will be on Place Value. We will be reading, writing, ordering and comparing numbers all the way up to 10,000,000. We will be rounding whole numbers and even using negative numbers. Next, we will move on to addition, subtraction, multiplication and division. Our aims during this section will be to solve addition and subtraction in contexts, and deciding which operations and methods to use. We will multiply multi-digit numbers up to 4 digits by a 2 digit number using the formal written method of long multiplication. Finally, we will divide numbers up to 4 digits by a 2 digit number using the formal written method of long division. We will be using many skills, such as; performing mental calculations, identifying common factors and using estimations to check our answers.

### Our targets are:

- Read, write, order and compare numbers up to 10,000,000.
- Use addition and subtraction methods to solve problems in a context.
- Multiply and divide multi digit numbers.

## Science

**Main topic focus - Light****Progression of skills being taught****Our targets are:**

I can use the idea that light travels in straight lines to explain that objects are seen because they give out or reflect light into the eye

I can explain that we see things because light travels from light sources to our eyes, or from light sources to objects, and then to our eyes

New homework is given out in children's purple homework books on **Mondays.
