PE and Sport Statement

At Ambleside Academy, we aim to provide the best PE and sport provision possible. We aim to deliver a programme of high-quality P.E. lessons, facilitate exercise and outdoor learning to support healthy lifestyles, and to provide a pathway to participation that will enable all pupils to build their confidence and achieve their full potential.

Primary School PE and Sport Premium for 2024/25

The government provides additional funding to improve the provision of physical education (PE) and sport in primary schools. This funding is provided the Department for Education, and is allocated directly to primary schools to achieve the vision for Primary PE and Sport Premium that:

ALL pupils leaving primary school will be **physically literate** and have the **knowledge, skills and motivation** necessary to equip them for a **healthy, active lifestyle** and **lifelong participation** in physical activity and sport.

This funding is ring-fenced and therefore can only be spent on the provision of PE and sport in schools.

Purpose of funding

The funding has been provided to ensure impact against the following objective:

To achieve self-sustaining improvement in the quality of PE and sport in primary schools. It is important to emphasise that the focus of spending must lead to long lasting impact against the vision that will live on well beyond the Primary PE and Sport Premium funding.

It is expected that schools will see an improvement against the following 5 key indicators:

- increasing all staff confidence, knowledge and skills in teaching PE and sport
- increasing engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity and sport
- raising the profile of PE and sport across the school, to support whole school improvement
- offer a broader and more equal experience of a range of sports and physical activities to all pupils
- increase participation in competitive sport

Eligible schools

Funding for schools will be calculated by reference to the number of primary-aged pupils (between the ages of 5 and 11), as recorded in the annual schools' census in 2024.

Ambleside Academy is due to receive **£21,190.00** of Primary school PE and sport funding for 2024/25
