English

We will be starting with the traditional tale of Goldilocks and the Three Bears, answering retrieval questions and moving onto writing our own traditional tale.

Maths

The children will start with recapping place value, looking at numbers up to 10,000. We will also be looking at Roman Numerals and rounding numbers to 10, 100 and 1000.

Science

Science this term sees Year 4 looking at living things and their habitats. They will be classifying vertebrates and invertebrates, identifying the features that make them different to each other.

Computing

Our computing curriculum will see the children learn to create a story board on their iPads to share their creative ideas with each other.



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PE

Autumn PE takes on some key physical skills to set the children up for success in the year to come. We revisit throwing and catching skills, and develop our coordination, dribbling and bouncing skills.

Music

Our music topic focuses on untuned percussion instruments whilst studying the style of Bhangra music. The children will be listening, responding and writing music notation. They will also be having a go at using iPads on BandLab!

PSHE

PSHE takes a deep dive into the importance of working as a team and including people in groups. Children will look into their rights and responsibilities and how to implement these into a classroom environment.

Geography

This term we will be looking at the features of a river and studying a local river. The children will be looking at the River Trent and will be able to spot the river bank, and the upper, middle and lower course.

History

History this term teaches us about the Anglo-Saxons, asking where they came from and why they came to Britain. Children will be investigating what life was like for the Anglo Saxons.

RE

This term, we will be looking at Judaism, delving into the agreements Jewish people make and how this links to our lives. It is always a subject filled with rewarding discussion and great group work!
