Computing

Our computing curriculum will concentrate on augmented reality. The children will progressively learn about the skills required for augmented reality before creating their own video.



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PE

During the Autumn term, the children will be learning the skills to play dodgeball and then focusing on the skills for martial arts dance.

Music

In music this term, year 5 will learning about untuned percussion and how to use these skills to structure and create a musical story which they will perform in groups.

PSHE

PSHE takes a deep dive into the importance of reflecting upon taking responsibility for actions and setting goals for the future. It is a fantastic and important subject that brings opportunity for independence.

Geography

Geography sees the children discovering how the earth is divided into longitude and latitude and dives into biomes across the planet.

History

Our first history topic of the year looks at the Ancient Greeks. The children will delve into the beliefs the Ancient Greeks had through myths and legends and how democracy was born through the 'Great Thinkers' of the time.

RE

RE this term focuses on the Hindu religion where children will learn about the practices Hindus follow. In the second half of the term, we will be learning more about Christianity with a focus around the story of Jesus.
